# Meet Skye Jethani - The Author of "With: Reimagining the Way You Relate to God"

Skye Jethani is an author, editor, speaker, consultant and pastor. He occupies numerous roles at Christianity Today, a leading communications ministry launched by Billy Graham in 1956.

Skye is ordained in the Christian & Missionary Alliance, a Protestant denomination established in 1887. The C&MA has approximately 500,000 members in the US and Canada, and an additional 3 million in 75 other countries. He earned a Masters of Divinity degree in 2001 from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois. While at Trinity, Skye served as a pastoral intern at Libertyville Evangelical Free Church and a student chaplain at Lake Forest Hospital. Miami

University in Oxford, Ohio, is where Skye conducted his undergraduate studies in History and Comparative Religion with a special focus on Islam. He also studied Buddhism, Judaism, and Early Christianity.

Skye and his wife, Amanda, have been friends since high school. They were married in 1999 and currently live in Wheaton, Illinois, with their three children Zoe, Isaac, and Lucy. Skye's father immigrated to the United States from India in 1970 to complete his medical training at Cook County Hospital in Chicago. His mother was a nurse and a native Chicagoan. Growing up in a multi-ethnic home gave Skye a diverse outlook and broad exposure to cultures. Before college he had already traveled to nearly 30 foreign countries on 5 continents. Skye grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and graduated from Glenbard South High School.



TPC is a nonprofit DuPage County organization which provides comprehensive programs and services related to teenage pregnancy and parenting. For almost 30 years, Knox has provided the facility, childcare room and family style meals as one of our vital mission and outreach programs. Additional Information about Services Provided by TPC

<u>Doula Services</u> - prenatal care, labor & delivery information and support

<u>Childbirth Education Classes</u> – covering prenatal care, preparing for labor & delivery



<u>Healthy Families</u> – Family Support Workers provide parenting information covering health and development of the child through weekly home visits for the first five years of the child's life. <u>Young Parent Groups</u>: Weekly teen parent group meetings provide educational and social support opportunities that help reduce the isolation young parents often face.

<u>Parents' Pantry</u> – An incentive based program where parents earn "baby bucks" through reaching set goals which can be redeemed for diapers, wipes, formula, etc.

<u>Teen Pregnancy Prevention</u> – TPC provides Teen Pregnancy Prevention programs at local schools in the community. This is delivered to junior high and high school students. This program also offers parents of adolescents information that encourages parents to be their children's primary health educator. This program has expanded to serve beyond DuPage County communities and served over 13,500 students last year!

#### Statistics:

- Less than 1% of Adolescent Family Strengthening Program participants were identified as the perpetrator of child abuse and/or neglect.
- Less than 1% of Family Strengthening Program participants have experienced a subsequent birth.
- 97% of Family Strengthening Program participants have followed the schedule of immunizations for their children.
- 91% of Healthy Families participants have an education and/or work related goal as part of their plan.
- 97% of Parent Group participants aged 18 or younger have graduated or are enrolled in high school or a GED program
- 98% of all students who attended a Teen Pregnancy Prevention program agreed with this statement, "...This presentation has made me more aware of the consequences of teen pregnancy."

#### And:

- A total of 551 teen parents were served through Adolescent Family Strengthening programs (CBE, Prenatal, Doula, Healthy Families and/or Group)
- A total of 425 unduplicated teen parents served.
- A total of 398 incoming referrals were received for this year compared to 348 in 2013.
- A total of 213 participants used Teen Parent Connection's Parents' Pantry this year, visiting 1,078 times.

- 3. Attend a SHP Training Session

Volunteers are required to renew their compliance with the SHP every 3 years.

Completed paperwork is to be dropped in the secure metal drop box which is located on the landing outside of the receptionist's office. This landing is at the top of the half flight of steps just inside of the front doors.

### Cash Management Budget Update



We reported in May that as a result of the long, cold (and <u>expensive</u>) winter we had experienced, Knox's energy and snow-removal costs had been driven to levels well in excess of budget. We have been able to make some progress, thanks in part to response to our request to bring pledged support up-to-date, in being able to bring our year-to-date receipts in line with our expenses, but still have some way to go. As of August 15, 2014, we have received 58.3% of our budgeted annual receipts and have expenses that total 59.9% of budgeted annual expenses. We again ask that you bring your 2014 pledged support up-to-date, or even prayerfully reconsider your estimate of giving, as we strive to be able to benefit our ongoing ministries. Thank you!
