Safe Haven Policy Requirements

Anyone planning to serve in Knox's Youth or Children's Ministries must comply with the requirements of the Knox Safe Haven Policy (adopted August 2012). These requirements are:

- 1. Read the SHP Policy and sign the Policy's Covenant Statement
- 2. Complete a Volunteer Application which is the last page of the SHP
- 3. Attend a SHP Training Session

Volunteers are required to comply with the SHP requirements every 3 years. So, if you attended a Training Session less than 3 years ago, you need only comply with steps 1 and 2 above. If it has been more than 3 years since you attended a Training Session, you need to comply with all 3 steps above.

Completed paperwork is to be dropped in the secure silver drop box which is located on the landing outside of the receptionist's office. This landing is at the top of the half flight of steps just inside of the front doors.

- You can pick up a copy of the Knox SHP from the sign-up tables or church office.
- Before attending a Training Session, read the Policy and bring it with you to the session.
