A Mote From Rev. Deborah Kapp...

A couple of years ago I bought a raspberry bush and planted it in my backyard. I'm not much of a gardener, but I discovered that one doesn't need to be much of a gardener to have one's raspberries thrive. They grow, they spread, and they produce fruit without very little effort from their humans. My raspberries are actually double producers—I get a crop in July and another one in September. It's great!

I love to go into the yard on a warm summer morning and harvest a handful of raspberries. They make me think about God, because of the way they grow. A single raspberry cane may bear, say, 20 berries, but not all of them ripen at the same time. They ripen a few a day, for several days, during a good, wet summer like this one has been, the harvest lasts for about two weeks. My experience is a little bit like the Israelites harvesting manna in the wilderness. Every day there is just enough for my berry-needs.

Why, you may wonder, does this make me think about God? In short it's because every summer my raspberries feel like a miracle. Yes, I planted them, but I did not make them grow, and I certainly do nothing to make them flower and bear fruit so regularly. I also do not parcel out this goodness so that it lasts as long as possible. God does all those things, just like God turns those berries to a beautiful, deep, purply red as they ripen. My raspberries remind me of how much in my life is a gift, a sheer gift from God.

In your world what reminds you of God's goodness? What surprises fill you with wonder? What bounty floods your soul with gratitude? What invites you, in the words of the Psalmist, to "taste and see that the Lord is good?"



- Return filled backpacks to Knox with the tag on the outside of the bag.



The Results of the Knox Website Survey Are In!

The website development team recently asked members to complete a short survey on the Knox website. The purpose of the survey was to give guidance to the team as we look to upgrade our website. Thank you to the 233 members who responded! The results of the survey are in and helped us understand three key things.

First, the site is used a lot, approximately 1600 visitor each month

- 53% of those surveyed visit weekly or monthly
- Only 9% of respondents have never used the site
- The most popular reason for visiting the site are:
 - o using the online calendar
 - o looking at program information
 - o registering for events
 - looking up phone numbers (for members of Knox Connections)
 - o listening to sermons



- 60% said our site was very easy or easy to use while 30% said navigation was fair
- 44% said there is nothing I dislike about the site

Finally, we learned where there is room for improvement.

- When asked what can be improved, 34% said information is hard to find
- 24% said information is not always current

There were also many suggestions for new features. Suggested improvements included:

- add a search bar
- provide an online photo directory (which is now available to Knox Connections members)
- have a more up to date calendar

Our final question gave pleasantly surprising results. When asked if you would be willing to receive the Knox News newsletter electronically rather than by mail 65% said yes. However, some of you did not give us your email so that we could send it to you electronically. If you are still getting the newsletter in the mail and would like to receive it via email instead, please call the office and let us know.
