"They set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star..." Matthew 2:9

Dear Friends,

On the twelfth day of Christmas we celebrate Epiphany, the "shining down of the light," when the star that proclaimed the birth of the Messiah led the Wise Men to Bethlehem. Epiphany comes in the depths of winter, after all the excitement of Christmas and New Year's Day are over. It reminds us that in Jesus Christ, the light of heaven is always with us—even in the valley of the shadow of death. "The light shines in the darkness," wrote John the Evangelist, "and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5).

Each year at Epiphany, we celebrate Star Sunday at Knox. Hundreds of words from Scripture are placed on individual stars. Each worshiper picks his or her own star from a basket to keep near for the coming year. Many people use a Bible concordance to see where and how their star word is used in Scripture. On the back of each star is the name of someone from our congregation to be remembered in prayer.

Some of the "star stories" people have shared about how the meaning of their star word has been revealed to them have been powerful indeed. The word 'epiphany' can mean a life-changing event of lasting significance, a newfound awareness, or even the vision to pursue something greater than ourselves into transforming relationships and brand-new opportunities to serve.

Like the Wise Men did of old, may we too look up from our lives, follow God's heavenly guidance over all earth's hills and valleys, and seek with all that we are to find, know and worship our Lord Jesus—the Light of the World.

In this Season of Light may the Lord "make His face to shine upon you..." and for all the year to come!

### Stephen Ministry at Knox

For nearly 30 years Knox has had a nationally accredited Stephen Ministry program. This remarkable program first started in 1975 under the leadership of Dr. Kenneth Haugk, who along with other professionals and pastors, could see the increasing need for pastoral care in congregations. Thus Stephen Ministry was born along with many resources and an involved training program whose purpose it was and is, to "equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" - Ephesians 4:12.

Today 11,000 congregations and over 150 denominations participate in this program which equips church members to come along side other other church members during times of crisis, illness, transition and so on. These one on one relationships are all done with utmost confidentiality and screening by church pastors. This is a Christ-centered listening ministry. Over the years we have heard people say time and again that having a Stephen Minister made all the difference in getting through their situation. They had a Christian friend who had been trained not to be a therapist or a solutions person, but to be an active listener who prayed with them and for them.

Over the years Knox has trained 54 Stephen Ministers. This ministry has been a wonderful and caring asset to the congregation and to the individuals served! Are you interested in having a Stephen Minister? Contact Revs. Deb or Cindy and they will be happy to give you further information.

When I first saw Heather\* at Hesed House, I was stunned by the look of anger, hate and suspicion emanating from her eyes. She almost looked as if she were possessed. Never, ever had I seen such a look – much less on the face of a three-year old child. What could cause someone so young, so innocent to harbor such rage? Trauma – the trauma of homelessness.

Heather and her family had recently moved from the overnight shelter into the Transitional Living Center, and she had joined us in the Harvesting Hope children's program, which runs two nights a week for 90 minutes. At first, she refused to participate and sat defiantly with her arms and legs crossed, her eyes darting suspiciously at the activities going on around her. Very gradually, over many weeks, as volunteers gently played beside her, softly talking about their activity and smiling when their eyes met hers, Heather's arms began to unfold, a look of curiosity replaced suspicion, until one day, she reached out for a toy and spoke. Her language was almost unintelligible, but it was clear her mind was very sharp. And then one evening, she looked up and smiled; she knew this was a safe place to be.

Harvesting Hope is one of the many volunteer programs benefiting families at Hesed House, and we are always in need of volunteers. If you have a Tuesday or Thursday night free and would like to join us either regularly or just occasionally to help implement preplanned programming with children ages 3-11, please give me a call at 630-416-1765. I'd be happy to tell you more about it.

If it were not for the overnight shelter at Hesed, Heather's family may never have secured the help they needed to get into the apartment where they live today. No child should experience the type of trauma Heather had known, but too many do, and organizations like Hesed give them the hope of a new beginning. Knox contributes to this effort on the fourth Saturday night of each month. Please consider joining other members through making a dish or working a shift; the sign-up sheet is in the narthex. This important ministry of hope will continue throughout the year ahead. We would love to have you join us.
