

A LETTER FROM REV CLINTON



Dear Friends,

I remember very clearly the first dollar bill I received as a small child because:

- a) It was more money than I had ever had before.
 - b) I tore it up

I had never earned a whole dollar. A quarter? Yes. Even fifty cents? Yes. But a <u>whole dollar</u>? Never. Back in 1961, a whole dollar went a long way further than now.

I suspect this was why my best friend Brad Frailey, when he was proudly shown my dollar, immediately demanded that I give it to him. I did not want to give Brad my dollar. But, after struggling with my conscience for a while, I decided I ought to share the dollar with Brad—for the same reason Mom and Dad expected me to share my toys. So I tore the dollar carefully in two and gave him half. They say that money isn't worth what it used to, but I can assure you that half a dollar bill is worth exactly the same in 1961 as it is today: it's worth nothing. Learning to share, however, just might be worth everything.

The apostle Paul writes to the Christians, "...you glorify God by...the generosity of your sharing" (2Cor. 9:13). Paul was asking them to do more than give: he was calling them to share. The Scriptures teach us that as believers, we're called to share our faith. We're called to share our possessions. And we're called to share our time. Sharing requires a living relationship while simply giving to others may not. It's like the difference between giving someone enough money to go and eat breakfast rather than inviting them to sit down and eat breakfast with you. Sharing involves us in the lives of others.

As followers of Jesus, we're called to share each other's joys and bear each other's burdens. We're called to encourage each other, abide with each other, admonish each other and keep faith with each other. As

members of one faith community, we're called to care for each other, provide for each other and pray for each other. Sharing these things requires more than money—it requires sharing our heart, mind, strength and time for God, for Christ and for the world.

Nowadays, there are so many worthy causes asking for our dollar that we would, if we could, tear it up into many pieces. What makes supporting the church priceless is that here we are called not just to give, but to share the good news of Jesus in a life of shared faith.

Dear friends, may you too be blessed abundantly as you generously share the love of Christ through the greatest gift of all: yourself.


Christmas Card Project – 2015
