
A LETTER FROM REV DEB

There are times when I go into our sanctuary and sit on the steps of a very quiet, unoccupied worship space. Often the room is dark but light streams through the stained glass window in the center wall. I sit and reflect.....upon sacred space and I wonder about the need for such. I imagine all the voices of praise and proclamation that fill this sacred space time and again; voices with life and hope, devotion and praise, comfort and challenge. I believe there is a need for "sacred space", for worship, that interrupts the busy demands and preoccupations of a 24/7 world.

I reflect on the Holy Spirit who stirs hearts and draws the bearers of those hearts into an experience of God's nearly forgotten presence, into a remembrance of God's gifts of grace and goodness, into a unity of spirit, against all the disruptive powers at work in the world. There is a longing of the soul that unites with the guiding of the Spirit and a desire "to praise God in the congregation" with singing and with prayer. There are always surprises for a dusty mind or a thirsty soul when we worship God together. It may be found in a prayerful whisper of peace as God's forgiveness is declared or the sound of hope as God's timeless promises are offered to each and to all. We are then "God-sent" into our world once again released and renewed.
