We offer an invitation to worship, study and share! September 10 kicks off our annual Fall Spiritual Emphasis with a new theme and a new opportunity for fellowship and friendship. Knox Fest, a sermon series and small groups put our fall into spiritual gear.

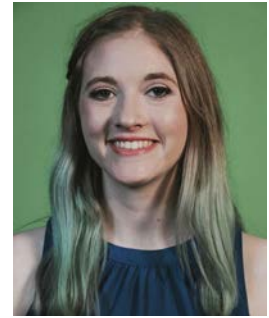
CHURCH NEWS

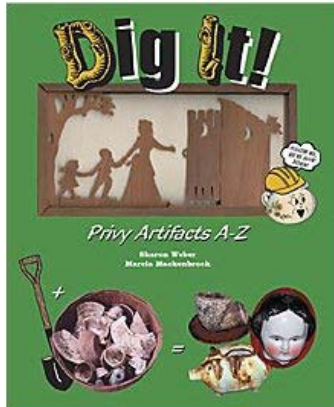


“POPcorn!”
