MISSIONS AT KNOX

Here is a note about the Sisseton Mission Trip

Families,

Knox has a Mission Trip each June in Sisseton, South Dakota. It is a great opportunity for families with children of all ages. It is a very meaningful experience and I still remember my time serving on the Sioux Reservation when I attended Go & Serve in High School.

This year the trip is from June 23 - 29. For more detailed information see above.

Below are three testimonies from some of our own Knox kids to help you get a better idea of what the week will be like...

For the past 14 years of my life, each summer at the end of June my family and I have traveled to the Wahpeton Sioux Reservation nestled in the rolling hills of South Dakota. This trip has always been meaningful despite whatever age I was. Life on the reservation is quite a cultural comparison to life here in the suburbs, a slap of reality to my somewhat sheltered life. This trip has drastically impacted my perspective and outlook on life. Each year as I help with the vacation bible school program I find myself receiving far more than I am giving. The love the children of the reservation give is unconditional, an experience like no other, one you can only get in Sisseton. The green rolling plains which the sun melts into can be seen nowhere but Sisseton. The old white wooden churches perched atop a hill, with a history that dates back decades can't be found anywhere but in Sisseton. This trip has allowed for me to grow personally, with members of Knox, with members of other churches, and most importantly it has allowed for me to show love to those who need it the most. It was so nice to see people from different churches and backgrounds come together to share God's love. On the last day, I was even able to help my mom who taught music by racing the kids in a song that they had practiced all week. I would be happy to teach you all if you just ask. My name is Mason McPeek and I am a 10 year old boy. Last year I attended my second year with the Dakota Partnership in Sisseton, South Dakota. Both years that I have been to Sisseton with my family I have worked with the construction crew. At first you wouldn't think that a young boy of 8 could do much but in my first year I collected nails that were discarded from the removal siding and a roof to keep the site safe. I also was a runner on the site moving boards, passing tools, and relaying measurements. The second year I did much of the same but was a bit stronger so I could help a bit more in moving scaffolding and tear down some of the boards. I really enjoy working on the site and seeing the old things that come out of walls and seeing what we can do to make the churches and buildings last many more years to come. Meeting others who also enjoy being the hands and feet of Christ and bringing the love of Jesus Christ to the people of the Dakota Sioux Nation is a true joy. I really can't wait to go back each and every year as I love to see my friends that I have made and working hard for others.

Faithfully Fit - Summer 2018

This year marks my 20 year anniversary of completing my very first Chicago Triathlon. As I was visiting over the Christmas holiday with my buddy Drew who did the race with me way back in 1998, we started to reminisce...and ultimately decided to give it a whirl again. I've done the race a handful of times over the years, and it's amazing each time. We do the Olympic distance which requires a .9 mile swim in Lake Michigan, a 25 mile bike on Lake Shore Drive, and a 6 mile run through the Museum Campus and Grant Park.

In order to do a race like this you simply have to do two things: 1. Train your body. 2. Keep a positive attitude. 3. Start my day with God.

As famed management guru Peter Drucker liked to say, "you can't manage what you can't measure." Over the years, I've used various methods to track my training progress: spreadsheets in the old days, and more recently I use apps on my smartphone like Map My Run, Strava, and the iPhone Health app. I also have tracked my weight consistently since 2006, weighing in every Monday morning (maybe that means one less cookie Sunday night knowing I have to get on the scale the next day!)

In addition to training your body, you need to train your mind. Invariably you will have aches, pains, and injuries over the course of a 3-8 month training season. Keeping a positive outlook on this and understanding that it's all part of the deal makes an enormous difference. I've found that starting my day with a devotional really sets the tone for my day and keeps me focused on what's important in life. Some of the devotionals I read come in via email, like Wisdom Hunters and Max Lucado. Other devotionals are part of short bible studies that I do with my wife, Kedra. The You Version bible app has all sorts of great plans that you can read on your own or with a friend. Another way to keep that positive attitude going is to be in relationships with other folks that have similar goals. There really is nothing like a little encouragement, friendly competition, and accountability to get you off that couch and living your most fulfilling life!

MINISTRY TO SENIORS

Need a ride to the Doctor? RAN can help!

Ride Assist Naperville (RAN) was founded in April 2016 to provide affordable and dependable transportation for seniors in our community, and their caretakers, to their medical appointments. RAN is a program under Naperville Seniors in Action (NSIA), a 501(c)(3) organization.



How does the service work?

This exciting initiative pairs seniors who need rides to and from their medical appointments with a volunteer driver to take them to the appointments, wait with them, and then drive them back home. Seniors (minimum age 60) must complete an application prior to requesting their first ride. Rides are by appointment only; a minimum of 5 business days advance notice is required. We ask for a \$12 donation for each round-trip ride. No money is given to the driver and no tipping is allowed; an invoice is sent the following month. All of our insured drivers are volunteers who use their own vehicles to provide transportation.

Rides covered:

Any type of medical or dental appointment (excludes procedures/surgery where anesthesia is administered), including regular check-ups, pacemaker checks, blood tests/lab work, vision, hearing, dialysis, x-rays/scans, wound care, physical therapy, chemotherapy.
